

LOUISIANA MEP ELIGIBILITY CHECKLIST

Does the “child(ren)” meet the definition of a “Migratory Child” (MC)?

AGE

- The child is younger than 22 years of age

SCHOOL COMPLETION

- The child is eligible for a free public education under State law

QUALIFYING MOVE FOR CHILD

(Does not have to be dependent of migratory qualifying worker’s move)

- Due to economic necessity; AND
- From one residence to another residence; AND
- From one district to another; AND
- Took place in the preceding 36 months

Does the “individual” meet the definition of “Migratory Qualifying Worker” (MQW)?

QUALIFYING WORK

- engaged in new temporary or seasonal employment or personal subsistence in agriculture soon after the move (within 60 days); OR
- did not engage in new temporary or seasonal employment or personal subsistence
- actively sought such new employment; AND
 - the individual has a recent history of moves for temporary or seasonal agriculture employment
- The new qualifying work is seasonal or temporary; AND
- The new qualifying work is agricultural or fishing

QUALIFYING MOVE FOR MIGRATORY QUALIFYING WORKER

(Does not have to be dependent of child’s move)

- Due to economic necessity; AND
- From one residence to another residence; AND
- From one district to another; AND
- Took place in the preceding 36 months

Qualifying Arrival Date (QAD) : Both MC and MQW must make a “Qualifying Move.”

- The child moved: (check one)
- as a Migratory Qualifying Worker (MQW),
 - with, a Migratory Qualifying Worker (MQW), or
 - to join a parent/guardian or spouse who is the Migratory Qualifying Worker (MQW).
